## Message from our Associate Pastor of Music & Ministries

## Why Do We Worship?

In my personal Bible study, I have been going through the book of Exodus. Exodus records the story of God rescuing the Israelites from the bondage of slavery in Egypt and establishing them as His people. One of the climaxes in this narrative is the crossing of the Red Sea.

God leads the Israelites on an unusual path to the Promised Land, so odd that the Egyptians believe they are lost. In response to this, Pharoah and his army pursue after them. Seemingly trapped between Pharoah's army and the Red Sea, God parts the sea and the Israelites cross on dry ground. The Egyptian army is then wiped out as they attempt to cross after them.

In response to this miraculous act of God, Moses and the people sing what is commonly referred to as "The Song of Moses" in Exodus 15. Verses 1 & 2 declare, "I will sing to the LORD, for he has triumphed gloriously; the horse and the rider he has thrown into the sea. The LORD is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him."

Just as the Israelites worshipped God in response to the salvation at the Red Sea, we worship God in response to our salvation at the cross of Christ. Why do we worship? We worship in response to what He has done! I look forward to doing just that this next Lord's Day!



# **A word from our Pastor**

This last week has seen another national horror take place with the shooting at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, TX, which saw 21 people killed, including 19 elementary students and 2 teachers. We grieve with this community and with the affected families.

Many are distraught by events as these, whether they be sinful events or destructive natural disasters, wondering where God is in the midst of this suffering. But we as Christians should take heart that God is still in control. Isaiah 45:7 says, "I form light and create darkness, I make well-being and create calamity, I am the Lord who does all these things." We find very clearly here that God is not only in control during the good times but also in the calamitous. This should not be a concern for us. It should not cause us to fear God or question Him, because He is also the same God who says that for those who love Him that He works all things for good (Romans 8:28). He is the same God of Joseph who was able to tell his brothers, "What you meant for evil, God meant for good." God is able to take calamity and use it for good as only he can. We are told in Ecclesiastes 7:14 "In the day of prosperity be joyful, and in the day of adversity consider: God has made the one as well as the other." God is sovereign in the adversity just as He also is in the prosperity.

Our job is not to question Him when we don't understand. Our job is to trust Him even when we don't understand. Proverbs 3:5-6 says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and DO NOT LEAN ON YOUR OWN UNDERSTANDING. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths." As Christians, we find peace in knowing that horrific sin and natural disasters do not show that God is not in control or that He is out of control, but rather it shows that He is IN control and using it for good.

Ephesians 4:17-19 says that the world's understanding of life is darkened. Because they reject Scripture, they have no understanding. But praise be to God that through the Holy Spirit taking the Holy Word of God and bringing it to light within our souls, we can understand. In times as these, let us shine the light of God's Word for a dark world who so desperately needs it.
