IN BOSTON, WORKERS AT THE SEND RELIEF ministry center help refugees deal with the trauma of leaving their home countries and teach them how to establish themselves in their new city. Through the Geneva Initiative, Send Relief partners with local churches to create Refugee Care Circles (RCCs) that surround refugee families and individuals with love and care as they begin the resettlement process. Stucke, Geneva Initiative Coordinator, described this as a team effort: "There can be over 40 people involved in the arrival process. . . . It is so amazing to see so many from the body of Christ donate items and time to strangers."
